• Office Help:

This is flexible in relation to volunteer's skill set. The work will entail a variety of tasks depending on current project deadlines. Responsibilities may include answering phones and other administrative tasks. This work helps to extend the resources of ARC to better assist the needs of our clients and the community.

 - o <u>SABE-R Self Advocates Group</u>: Support group meetings, activities, and community events. Assist with identifying individual and group goals, tasks and strategies. Initiate strategic action plans accordingly. SABE-R meets at the ARC office from 6 to 7 pm on the 2nd Tuesday of each month.
 - o <u>AKtion Club</u>: A Kiwanis-Family Member. Mentor and advise club members in their community service projects. AKtion Club members learn and exercise leadership skills while supporting their community. AKtion Club meets at the ARC office from 7 to 8 pm on the 2nd Tuesday of each month.
 - Dances and Other Social and Recreational Activities: Volunteers help set-up, supervise, take photos, serve food, and clean-up at these events as needed.
 - <u>Petition Project Leaders:</u> (Aug.—Nov.) We need assistance with gathering signatures for town funding petitions. Most Rutland County Towns require petitions for placement of ARC funding requests on voting ballots, Evenings and Saturday mornings seem to work best.
